My Sincere thanks to Dr. P. Nongtdu, Principal, who bestowed upon me this opportunity to look back to the activities and events during the session 2015-16. However, without the co-operation of the faculty members, staff and students of the College it would not have been possible to pen down the Journey 2015-16. I also express my heartfelt gratitude to the Governing Body of the College, Office of the Deputy Commissioner, Khliehriat and other agencies for being supportive and backing us up during the session.

At the onset, the College re-opened on 4th February 2015 after the winter break and called for a staff meeting welcoming the teaching and non-teaching staffs. The meeting was to discuss the upcoming academic activities, examination, assessment and accreditation of the College, etc. The Principal also urged the Assistant Professors, Member Secretary of various sub-Committees to carry out the work as plan especially for preparation of the proposed NAAC visit. Apart from that, the Principal also requested the Member Secretary of various Committees and HoDs to prepare and submit the plan of action to the coordinator of the IQAC for timely action.

For the smooth functioning of External examinations that was held on 17th February to 31st March 2015, the Evaluation and Examination Committee presented a detailed invigilation programme. Like precedent years, the Academic Session 2015-16 started in the month of April for both Undergraduate (Annual System/Semester System) and Higher Secondary level (Arts and Commerce) respectively. The Committee also conducted internal examinations including tests, assignments, etc. in the College.

The NSS and RRC Units organized different social works under Regular Activities and Special Camping in and outside the College.

Lada weng noh ïa ki ka senten kan long kaba dkoh. Kane ka ïahapdur bad ka jingong u Partha Sarathi Misra "The definite article 'the' functions as a cohesive device when it indicates that the item in question is specific and identifiable." (31) (ka definite article ha ka Khasi ki dei 'u' bad 'ka'. Ki trei kam kum ki cohesive device haba ki kdew ïa ka mat ba donkam bad kata ka mat ka dei ban long kaba tikna bad kaba lah ban ïohi). Kumta ki kyntien u/ ka kum ki definite article ki don ka bynta kaba teh song ïa ka senten. Lah ruh ban ïohi ïa ka dur-thoh lyngba ka jingbuh ryntih ïa ki kyntien (cohesion) na ka liang kata ka Anaphoric bad CataphoricCohesion kiba pynpaw ïa ka jingïadei jong ki kyntien ha ki kyrdan jong ki senten. ïa kane ka jinglong la shem ha kum kine ki laiñ jong ka poim 'Ki Symboh Ksiar' (dkhot V) haba u myllung u la rwai kumne:

Kumta ka dur-thoh lyngba ka jingbuhryntih ïa ki kyntien ka pynpaw ba u myllung Soso Tham u long uba tbit ban pyndonkam ïa la ka ktien. Bad ka dur-thoh jong u ka pynpaw ïa ka jingriewspah jong ka ktien Khasi. Ha kane ka jingthoh, la wanrah ïa ka rukom pyrkhat u Khasi shaphang ka spah. Ha kaba batai ïa ka jingmut jong ka spah kat kum ka pyrkhat u Khasi, donkam ban phai sha ka jingsngewthuh jong ki katto katne ngut ki nongthoh Khasi bapaw khmat. Napdeng ki nongthoh Khasi u Homiwell Lyngdoh u la leh bha ha kaba wanrah ïa ka jingbatai halor ka spah. Ha ka kot jong u, *Ka Niam Khasi*, u thoh kumne shaphang ka spah:

Ka 'spah ka phew' jong ka ïing Khasi ka long ka tyngka ka sbai, ka jingdeng ka jingkup, ka khiew ka pliang, ka blang ka masi ka sniang, ka bri ka khyndew bad ka snap ka skor baroh ba kata ka ïing ka longtrai (154).

Kitei ki jingdon ba la kdew haneng, la ka long ka pisa pliah, ki jingdeng jingkup, ki tiar ki tar, ki jingri jingdup, ka khyndew ka shyiap bad kiei kiei kiba long trai da ka ïing ki dei ka spah jong ka ïing. Ka jingbatai jong u HomiwellLyngdoh kam long satia tang ka jingsngewthuh jong u shimet, hynrei ka pynpaw ïa ka pyrkhat u Khasi salonsar. U H.O. Mawrie ha ka kot *Ka Longiing Longsem U Khun Khasi Khara*, u pynshai lem kumne halor kane ka bynta, "Ki jingri jingdub ruh ki long ka bynta jong ka spah ïing" (37). Dei namar kata ka daw ba ym long ban pynïakhleh ïa ki bad ka jong kiwei pat, namar ba ki dei ka spah jong ka ïing. Kumta u H.O. Mawrie u thoh shuh shuh: "Ha ka pyrkhat Khasi jong ngi kam long kaba bha ban set lang ia ki jingri bad ki jong kiwei pat" (37). Haba bishar ïa ka jingsngewthuh u Khasi shaphang ka spah, la shem ba la pynbynta ïa ka spah ha ka rukom kaba bniah bha. Kat kum ka jingbatai jong u Homiwell Lyngdoh, kine harum ki long ki rukom ba u Khasi u bynta ïa ka Spah:

Ka spah ka phew jong u shynrang ne ka kynthei, kaba ki kamai haba ki dangshong marwei ne ki dangshong-khynraw, ka long ka "kamai khynraw" jong ki lane ka "nongkhynraw." Ka nongkhynraw u shynrang ne ka khynthei kaba ki kamai haba ki shong ha ïing-kur, lada ki la leit ne kim pat leit ïing-briew, ka long ka "kamai iing-kur." Ka khih ka kamai jong u shynrang ne ka kynthei, kaba ki ïoh ynda ki la shong la sah ha iing-tnga iing-khun ka long ka "kamai iing-khun." Bad ka spah ka phew kaba wan hiar pateng, pateng la pateng, naduh ka iawbei-tynrai ne ka iawbei-tynmen ne ka iawbei khynraw, ka long ka "nongtymmen" (154).

Kat kum katei ka jingbatai haneng, u Khasi u bynta ïa ka spah sha ki lai bynta ne lai jait kynthup ïa – (1) ka kamai nongkhynraw kaba long ka kamai ïingkur (2) ka kamai ïingkhun bad (3) ka nongtymmen.

Kum ka jingai jong u Blei, u briew u dei hok ban ïoh ïa ka spah, tangba u dei ban ïoh ïa ka da ka lynti kaba dei. U Khasi u don ka jinghikai kaba shai ha ka jingïadei u briew bad ka spah, kumno ban lum spah. Ban pynkynmaw ïa ka jinghikai jong u Khasi, u Radhon Singh Berry ha ka kot Ka Jingsneng Tymmen Shaphang Ka Akor Khasi Ha KaRukom rwai Phawar II, u thoh kumne:

Wat ju peit shin eh ïa ka spah ki briew, Ba ha ka jingmut wan shoh kaba sniew; Ïa ka spah kiwei wat ju ïai ïalap, Ba ï'u kylla tuh, kylla nongpynïap (1-4).

Ha ka jingïadei bad ka jinglum spah, u Khasi u hikai ba ym dei ban peit shin ne ban i kwah ïa ka spah jong kiwei pat, ïoh ba ka jingmut sniew ka ïalam sha ka tuh, ka lute bad sha ka jingpynïap briew.

Ka kamai kajih lane kano kano ka lad ban lum spah ka dei ban long da ka lynti jong ka kamai hok. Ki Khasi hyndai ki hikai ba dei ban kiar na ka jinglum spah da ka lynti bymhok. Hynrei katba nangïaid ki sngi ki por, ka jingpyrshang ban lumspah da ki lynti bymhok ka la nang kynrei. Dei namar kata ka daw, ba ka mih sa ka spah bymhok. ïa ka jinghikai u Khasi shaphang ka spah bymhok, lah ban sngewthuh shuh shuh na ka jingbatai u Sib Charan Roy ha ka kot, *Ka Niam-ki-khasi ka Niam Tip-Blei-Tip-Brieu*, haba u thoh:

Wat ju kmen ia ka iohei ne ka umsyep kiwei,
Ba long byrsieh ia la ka ïing la ka jingtrei shongblei.
Ka tyngka ia khalai, ka tyngka thangiap ne nongsam,
ym ju bit ban wan khleh ha la u synñiang u bynhei, ki shu pynlut madan.

U Sib Charan Roy u la fiiewtang ia ki lad bu u briew u lah bun ioh lum ia ka spah bymhok, kynthup ia ka mar ne ka spah iohei, ka tyngka ia khalai, ka tyngka bumsap, ka jinglute, ka jingkhaji martuh bad kiwei ki lynti bymhok. U kdew bu ki longshuwa ki kheiñ ba kine buroh ki long ka "tyngka pap", kaba mut ka spah bymhok. Ka jingbutai u Sib Charan Roy, ka pyni ba ka spah bu u briew u ioh da kitei ki lynti ka dei ka spah bymhok.



Thomas Jones-1 ryngkat ka burom kaba ha kiba ha jrong tam eh ruh ia U Blei Trai Kynrad Nongbuh Nongthaw bad Nongpynlong ia kiei kiei baroh ha jrong ha tbian, nga sngew ba ka long ka kabu kaba biang eh ia nga lyngba jong kane ka pongshai ban iasam bad pathai lem ruh sha ki nongpule ia kane ka jingthoh kaba nga la iohpateng na ka thup Ka Pateng Khristan, June (Jylliew) 2005. Nga sngew ruh ba kane ka dei shi bynta jong ka jingrakhe kynmaw burom ia ka lyngkhuh lyngksiar snem ba 175 jong ka jingiuh kjat u Thomas Jones bad I Mem Ann Jones ha kane ka Ri baieit eh jong ngi. Lyngba jong kane ka jingphla-shem-mynsiem jong u, kyrmen skhem ba ngin lah ha ka juh ka por ban iohi kham hajan ia ka rynieng ryniot jong u bad sngewthuh kham bha ruh ia ka jingkhraw jong une u Radbah. Kane ka symboh jingkren jong u ka dei

Hashuwa ba u Thomas Jones bad I Mem Ann Jones kin mih na la ka ri, ka Foreign Missionary Society ka la pynlong ia ka Jingiaseng Ai Khublei kaba kyrpang ha Iingmane Bah ha Rose Place, Liverpool ha ka 4 trik u Naiwieng, 1840. Ka jingiaseng ka la long kaba rhem la kum ka ding U Mynsiem Bakhuid.Ka la neh jin haduh 3 kynta shiteng ei ei.Ha kane ka Jingiaseng, u Thomas Jones u la ieng ha khmat u paidlang jong u Blei bad phla shem mynsiem kumne:

"La bun snem ka la long ka jingkwah jong nga ban long u nongiathuhkhana bad u nongialap, lada u Trai u ibit ban pynlong ia nga. Ka pynkhuslai ia nga ban sngewthuh ba da ki hajar ki para bynriew kim shym la iohsngew wat shaphang U Blei bad U Khrist, bad haba nga la pyrkhat sani bha shaphang ia la ka jinglong bad ba nga latip kham bun shaphang ka burom jong U Nongpynim, nga la kut jingmut ban aiti ia kaba sah jong ka jingim jong nga ban ialap ha kito ki bym pat tip ia U.Ngam shym la ngeit ba kano kano ka kynhun seng kan phah ia nga pynban nga la kut jingmut ban leit da kano kano ka lynti. Ka rai shaphang jonng nga ka lamih hadien katto katne por jong ki jingpyrkhat bad nga la jan bakla khlieh bad nga la sngew kumba nga la duh ia ka bor pyrkhat bad nga la duwai ia U Blei ban pynioh pat ha nga ia ka jingtip briew. Khatduh ki para ba-ngeit ki la rai ba nga dei ban sdangban pynkhreh ia ka bynta ka jingtrei kaba la don slemha ka jingmut jong nga. Nga la pyrkhat bunsien la kumno kumno ba ngan iap noh shuwa ba ngan lah ban leit hynrei pynban ka jingkut jingmut ka dang iai don bad ba ka tynrai ka dang iai sah. Katba U Blei u la pynshai ia nga bad ba ka jingieit jong nga ia la U Kynrad ka nang kyrsoi hapoh la ka mynsiem,ka jingthrang ban leit ka nangjur, hynrei la don ki



sngi kiba pher haba nga la kylli ia lade 'Balei nga dei ban ieh ia la ka Ri bad ia la ki paralok na ka bynta jong no re?' Nga la don ka jingsngewlung mynsiem bad nga la iaid lait ia kiba bun ki sngi ki miet haba ka jingpyrkhat ban iehnoh ia la I pa bad I mei ka la pynpait ia ka dohnud jong nga. Kam dei ka kam kai haba pyrkhat ban iehnoh shirta. Hynrei nga dei, nga dei, nga dei ban leit, namar nga la pynlong ka jutang bad U Trai halor ka nongrim jong ka jingduwai jong nga: Trai, phah ia nga, bad wat ialam ia nga nangne lymda ka khmat jong me ka leit lem bad nga. Ha kata ka por ka Ri India ka la wan ha ka jingmut jong nga bad nga la shem ba ka long kaba eh ban sngewhun jrut ha kaba leit shano shano shawei pat. Shano? Ka jingjied jong nga ka long hangno re hangno hajan ka wah *Ganges*. Teng teng nga la pyrkhat ia ka Burma ne ka Hindustan lem bad u paidbah jong ka. Kumno re hamar kata ki para ba-ngeitki la ia kut ban phah ia ngaha ka khappud hapdeng ar tylli ki jingngeit niam, kata ka long ha ki Lum Khasi. Ha kawei ka liang don ka niam ki nong Burma bad ha kawei pat ka niam Hindu ka paw shai kdar ha nga ba kane ka dei ka jaka ha kaba kan bha tam ia nga ban leit.

Ngam ju sngewtynnat ban iai neh slem ha kano kano. Shipor nga la trei kum u Mistri sa shipor pat kum u nongthain jain ruh. Shisien nga la trei ha ka karkhana tylliat kba bad ruh kum u nongshna tiar dewbyrtha. Hangne mynta nga don ba la phah sha ka jaka kaba nga hap ban leh ia kiei kiei da lade khlem ei ei. Ngan nym ioh iing ban shong ban sah lymda nga tei ia ka da lade, lymne u kpu khlem da puh hi ia ka khyndew bad yn ym don doctor ba kham bha ban ia lade. Mynta, kum u Apostol, nga kyrpad ko ki parabangeit duwai na ka bynta jong nga. Mynhynnin nga la ioh sngew ia ki paralok barim jong nga kiba pule ha Bala College ki la ia mynjur ban kynduh lang ban duwai na ka bynta jong nga.

Ki ong ba ka *Jamaica* ka long ka jhad kaba bha bad nga ngeit u *Captain* ruh u long u briew u ba sbun hynrei ban ia kine baroh nga kham ngeit ba ngin ia poi shaduh ba ngin lait lyngba ka jingduwai jong phi. Duwai ba ngan ioh jingiarap ban jop ia ka dohnud sniew. Kane kan don bad nga hangno hangno. Ngam lah ban iehnoh ia ka hynrei pan na U Trai ban sumar ia nga na kano kano kaba sniew ha kaba shapoh ne habar. Kan long ka jingmyntoi bad ka jingisnei bakhraw lada la sumar ia nga na kaba leh sniew, hynrei ngan nym hun tang kumta lada ngam lah ban leh bha ei ei. Nga kwah ban im ban ioh leh shibun kiei kiei ban rep ban riang ban tei iingmane hynrei nalor kata nga kwah ba phin pyrkhat lem ia nga ban sah katno katno snem haduh ba ngan da nang ia ka ktien jong ki bad ba nga lah ban ialap ia U Khrist sha ki briew. Everyone of this generation who had attended colleges or universities must sure have heard of the term 'National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC)' and its function though not in details. Until April 2014, I have known NAAC as the assessor and grade-giver to different colleges but I was totally unaware of the process of its assessment.

It was when the team from Synod College, Shillong arrived for a one-day workshop to highlight the staff of the college about the procedures and strategies for NAAC preparation that the nightmare started. Though now, those recollections appeared humorous and gibberish.

The constant rushing ups and running downs was part of our preparation for the inspection day. It was always about catching – up with time. Staying up late in the college till eight, sometimes nine o'clock at night was a daily routine for most assistant professors. Putting effort was not a difficult task but lack of experiences stammered our confidence. Maintaining and keeping records was new to us.
