About the College

Jaintia Eastern College, Khliehriat, was established in 1992 as a Non-profit, Co-Educational Institution, guided by the motto “*EDUCATION FOR ALL*”. Affiliated to North Eastern Hill University (NEHU), Shillong, the college offers undergraduate program in Arts and Commerce along with Postgraduate courses in M.A. Khasi and Education. Concept Note:

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, unveiled by the Government of India in July 2020, serves as a comprehensive blueprint for the future of the country’s education sector. It supersedes the previous National Policy on Education of 1986. The Policy aims to improve the overall quality of education in India. One of the key aims of NEP 2020 concerning teachers is to foster an environment conducive to creative thinking while empowering them with greater autonomy in the teaching-learning process.

The Outcome-Based Education (OBE) entails a restructuring of teaching methodologies and assessment practices within educational institutions to align with desired students’ learning outcomes. It also emphasizes on the development of critical thinking, problem-solving, and other 21st century skills among students besides emphasizing a student-centric approach wherein course delivery and assessment are meticulously planned to achieve pre-defined objectives and outcomes.

The objective of this FDP is to acquaint faculty members with the objectives outlined in NEP 2020 and to introduce them to the concept of Outcome-Based Education and Essential AI Tools for Teachers. Further, the FDP seeks to deepen the understanding of OBE and use of technology in teaching learning and assessment practices. Additionally, it aims to equip teachers with insights into emerging trends in the teaching and learning landscape.

About the FDP

Though the Policy was implemented on 29th July 2020 in the country but in the state of Meghalaya it was implemented from the academic year 2023-24 encountering various issues and challenges. To address all these issues, the IQAC of the college proposed to conduct National Level Faculty Development Program (FDP) on NEP 2020: Outcome Based Education and Essential AI Tools for Teachers on **24th May, 2024**.
