Department of English

Specific Outcomes:

Studying English literature will introduce the student to English literature and will provide the necessary background for the study of English literature. The language component will sensitize the student to the formal aspects of English language. The objective of the course is to orient students with the study of significant texts on criticism and will introduce to student the critical reading of creative texts as an essential part of reading and skills to interpret literary text which is a reward part of a life-long commitment to learning. Studying of poetry will provide a comprehensive guide to English poetry, its development, its form and movement throughout the ages.

The objective of studying fiction is to acquaint students with important works of fiction of the second half of the nineteenth century and the first half of the twentieth century. Some representative novels of the period have been included so as to familiarize the students with the important trends and to impart students with the following objectives:-

- 1. Equip students with knowledge of English as a world language.
- 2. Equip student with analytical skills in linguistics, communications and literary criticism.
- 3. Recognize and appreciate the importance of major literary genres, subgenres, and
- 4. Increasing in-depth Knowledge of the Core Areas of the Subject.
- 5. Train students for careers and advanced studies in a wide range of English, Public Relations, or Communications fields.

Course Outcomes:

Specific learning outcomes for English courses include the following:

- 1. Writing skills and process: Students will be able to write effectively for a variety of professional and social settings. They will practice writing as a process of motivated inquiry, engaging other writers' ideas as they explore and develop their own.
- 2. Critical Approaches: Students will be able to express their own ideas as informed opinions that are in dialogue with a larger community of interpreters, and understand how their own approach compares to the variety of critical and theoretical approaches.
- 3. Oral communication skills: Students will be able to prepare, organize, and deliver an engaging oral presentation in English.

Department of Economics:

- 1. As the undergraduate course contains the fields of elementary microeconomics, macroeconomics, basic statistics and mathematical economics students are well equipped with the knowledge based on Economic principles including Consumer's behaviour, Producer's behavior and Market structure. Students are familiar with the tools of Statistics and Mathematical Economics.

They are not only meant to make the students familiar with the dominant events of different ages, but also to open out new perspectives, the student may acquire a knowledge of the changing nature of politics or kingdoms of the changing times.

Department of Political Science:

Students are developed with the capability to lead teams as well as be effective team members and who can work and communicate effectively with diverse team members to identify and solve problems and make responsible recommendations.

Fundamentals of Business Communication

To impart knowledge about basic communication to enable the students to think, observe and express effectively in this competitive world. To develop the ability of the students to communicate clearly and correctly in English and regional languages on the matters related with business operation with emphases on quality of presentation. To help the students to understand various aspects of business and to develop communication skills and overall personality development of the students.

Corporate Accounting:

This course aims to enlighten the students on the accounting procedures followed by the Companies. To enable the students to be in conformity with the provision of the Companies Act while dealing on Corporate Accounting and become experts in corporate account management like liquidation, holding account, amalgamation, absorption and external reconstruction etc. They become familiar about accounts of insurance companies, banking. To give an exposure to the students about company final accounts. The contents of 'Corporate Accounting' have been designed to impart basic knowledge of various aspects of accounting of corporate world.

Indian Contract Act:

The basic objective of this course is to provide knowledge about Indian Contract Act.

Cost Accounting:

To keep the students conversant with the ever - enlarging frontiers of Cost Accounting knowledge and techniques. The students understand clearly how to reduce and control the cost during the course of production because cost is a vital aspect in the modern business. To provide knowledge base about the ascertainment of the profitability of each of the products and advised the management to maximize its profits.

Auditing:

This course enables the student to be well versed in the fundamental concepts of Auditing. This course gives the knowledge of examines the principles and practices of internal and external auditing. The students can capable to understand the auditing as a component of recurrent and strategic activities, risk assessment, internal control, systems evaluation, forensic accountability, and contemporary audit issues and challenges

Indian Partnership Act

To equip the students with the basic concept of Indian Partnership Act and latest judgments made from time to time and to make student understand the concept and practices of partnerships and be clear about the Act. Students clearly understand the 'principal - agent relationship' among the partners. They are enabled to differentiate between partnership and other various forms of organization.

Public Finance:

The goal is to develop students' analytical and consulting skills in the area of public finance. The course is targeted to those students whose major is in public administration, business government relations, or management in the service industry (education, health care, culture, etc.). To introduce students to the public sector reform with focus on public finance issues. This course is aimed at students who are interested in fiscal policy including tax and expenditure law and policy concerning how to fund government effectively. It examines the key challenges of fiscal policy in achieving sufficient revenues, economic prosperity and development and in addressing social justice and inequality in a context of globalization. The course provides an introduction to public finance law and policy; tax policy principles; and tax reform and law design principles.

Department of Khasi:

Programme Outcomes:

Teaching – learning process is delivered through lectures, group-work, workshops, seminars, guided reading, etc. Considerable attention is given to methods in teaching - learning and assessment such as sessional examination, class tests, group discussions, discussion of previous year question papers, assignments and project works. Tutorial classes and remedial coaching classes are also conducts to cover up the loss classes as well as to help slow learners improving performance in the university examinations.

The method of teaching is not static, but continually evolves and changes with technological as well as pedagogical developments, including developments in the use of information technology and other media. Further, study tour is organized to familiarize students with the knowledge they have acquired and taught in the class.

Departmental meetings were conducted to share views and opinions and to assess the student's understanding of the subject/topics being taught in the class. Apart from academic activities, the faculty members are actively involved in extracurricular activities of the College.

It also collaborates with other agencies and various departments of the College to organize and participate in seminars, talks, etc. Eminent literary personalities were invited to deliver lecture and interact with the students and teachers.

Specific Outcomes:

The Department has two main streams – Khasi Modern Indian Language (Compulsory) and Khasi Second Language (Elective). The Khasi honours subject includes 8 (Eight) papers and the curriculum is most comprehensive, encompassing Khasi culture, History of Khasi literature, Khasi grammar which was studied in the wider context of linguistics and almost all the literary genres like Drama, Fiction, Poetry and Khasi literature in translation. The Department has emerged as a training ground for in-depth study and reference work of different authors.

Program Outcomes (POs): Program outcome are statements about the knowledge, skills and attitude (attributes) the students should have at the end of a formal program. Program outcome are broader statements that describe what the students are expected to learn and would be able to do after their Master Degree. This program will provide opportunities to Graduates with particular interest in Khasi Language and will acquire deeper insight into Khasi language and literature. It will enhance and reinforce creativity, understanding and critical appreciation of Khasi Literature.

The impact of the importance of Khasi Language upon students

- 1. Understanding the Khasi Literature
- 2. Knowing the culture of the indigenous tribe
- 3. Broaden the critical thinking ability
- 4. Development of ethics
- 5. Development of expression and creativity.

Course Outcomes (COs): The Course outcomes are course specific that relate skills, knowledge, and behavior the students acquire through this program. They cover all core course related outcomes, and contribute to the overall attainment of program outcome. Through the papers prescribed, students will learn some of the cultural aspects, the monolith culture and traditional Folk literature of the Khasis. It helps the students acquire a deeper knowledge of Culture, Language, Literary Theory and Research methodology. It gives the resultant knowledge and skills the student acquires at the end of each course. It defines the cognitive processes a course provides.
